Kosovo media Highlights

Holkeri meets Contact Group, next week 'big meeting' with leaders (*Koha*)

Amongst the 'serious meetings' that Harri Holkeri had in New York after the UNSC session was the one with the representatives of the Contact Group, *Koha Ditore* reported. According to international sources the operationalization of the standards were discussed in this meeting and it was decided to send an American diplomat to Pristina in order to meet all Kosovar leaders including those from the minorities. In those meetings, a plan for operationalizing the standards would be presented by that American diplomat as well as the further actions for Kosovo's institutions that would follow this plan, *Koha Ditore* reported.

EFC in principle approves Kosovo budget of 613 million of euros (*Koha*)

Koha Ditore reported that the EFC in principal approved the limits of the budget that were determined by the budget commission. Kosovo's budget for 2004 is foreseen to be 613 million Euros.

The budget will be definitely determined in the next EFC meeting that is scheduled to take place on November 17.

Kosovar leaders: Holkeri presented his priorities to the UNSC (Zëri)

Zëri reported about the reactions that Kosovar leaders gave regarding the recent SRSG's report to the UNSC.

Holkeri had presented his priorities to the UNSC, but not the idea that they had agreed upon in Pristina, that UNMIK and Kosovar institutions were partners, said assembly speaker Daci. 'I have a fundamental comment. In our meetings we have agreed to be good partners, therefore the one who brakes the agreement should be held responsible for the consequences,' Daci was quoted as saying.

Holkeri was more focused on his priorities such as the dialogue with Belgrade and the position of the minorities, but the report itself had a positive approach, said Kosovo Prime Minister Bajram Rexhepi.

'I think that a major part of that report was focused on the dialogue with Belgrade and the violence that happened here, but there were also positive elements such is the issue of warrants and the request to cancel them,' Rexhepi was quoted as saying.

Paper further quoted Muhamet Hamiti, spokesperson of Kosovo's President Ibrahim Rugova, as saying that the priorities for Kosovo's institutions were economic development, privatization, investments, and enhancing the democratic society. 'Our main priority is recognition of Kosovo's independence that will boost the economic and democratic developments here,' Hamiti was quoted as saying.

The head of Coalition Povratak at the Kosovo assembly Dragisa Krstovic wasn't satisfied with Holkeri's report. In particular he wasn't satisfied with the condemnation that Holkeri made on the parallel structures in Kosovo. 'These structures were created because of the lack of security for the Serbian minority,' Krstovic said.

Holkeri meets American officials (Zëri)

Zëri reported that Holkeri had meetings with officials of the US government. UNMIK administration in Pristina would not say what the agenda of these meetings was, but Holkeri confirmed by phone that 'the meetings were serious'.

Daci: Constitutional Framework is neither Koran nor Bible (Koha)

Koha Ditore reported that Kosovars do not like Holkeri's statement that the Constitutional Framework cannot be changed in Pristina.

'I think that the Constitutional Framework is not the Bible or the Koran. It is written there that with time it could be changed,' said Kosovo assembly speaker Nexhat Daci. He further said that the initiative for changing the Constitutional Framework had not started without preliminary consultations.

SRSB Harri Holkeri said on Thursday that the Kosovo Assembly couldn't change the Constitutional Framework. 'It can be changed in New York but not in Pristina,' he was quoted as saying in New York.

EU opposes biased changes of the Constitutional Framework (Zëri)

Zëri reported that the EU was concerned regarding new demands by the Kosovo Assembly for changing Kosovo's legal framework. The EU officials said that Kosovars should obey the international regulations that derive from Resolution 1244.

Disagreements in the Contact Group regarding time for beginning talks about Kosovo's status (Zëri)

Zëri reported that the international community is still not unified on the question of when the talks on Kosovo's final status should begin.

Even though they say that they have the same approach regarding Kosovo's future, the world powers, the members of the Contact Group currently have no unified opinion on when talks on Kosovo's final status should begin. Different to other countries, France supports the idea 'not to begin talks on the final status in 2005', paper reported.

Ivanovic demands ten years moratorium on Kosovo status (Zëri)

'Talks on Kosovo's status will begin in 2005 and they will not finish in only few years time. Serbia should go for a solution of ten years of moratorium, then sign an agreement for association and stabilization,' Kosovo Assembly deputy speaker Oliver Ivanovic said. He further added that 'Kosovo will neither be independent nor a part of Serbia', *Zëri* reported.

Walker: Yes, in Kosovo was war, not an armed conflict (all dailies)

All dailies reported on the visit of the former American ambassador and former OSCE Verification Mission chief in Kosovo William Walker.

'What was that here when NATO airplanes dropped bombs, while fighting was going on on the ground? According to my definition this was a war,' Walker was quoted as saying.

Following the same issue *Koha Ditore* quoted Walker as saying that 'I am disappointed with a few things that haven't happened here or have happened to slow'.

Asked about Holkeri's report at the UNSC, Walker said that a positive element mentioned in that report was the demand for the cancellation of warrants against Kosovar leaders.

Bota Sot conducted an interview with UNMIK Pillar IV Nikolaus Lambsdorff.

Why was the third round of privatization stopped?

The third round of privatization was stopped as an emergency measure. We had to do it as soon as possible.

Who charged the KTA in New York's court?

I think it was an American businessman that sued KTA.

However, KTA is an institution and nobody should fear personal charges...

This would be very nice but unfortunately this is not the case. This case has shown that KTA can be sued in other courts apart from the special chamber of the Kosovo Supreme Court.

Shala: Messages for Pristina from New York (Zëri)

Zëri carried an editorial by Blerim Shala who writes:

As it was expected, Holkeri's first report to the UNSC received increased attention of our officials. Everybody expected that Holkeri's report would have pessimistic elements.

In this sense they might be satisfied after October 30. However, Holkeri was very clear in describing the situation in Kosovo and in his answers to demands from the assembly and Kosovo's government. Therefore, Holkeri from New York addressed more into direction Pristina and Kosovars rather than to the UNSC. This approach shows what is the position of Kosovars towards SRSG. Holkeri, as his predecessors, did not take Kosovars officials to New York. Further more Holkeri did not create the illusion that he had consulted with our officials before compiling the report, even in those fields that are the responsibility of our governors. If that was the case, the SRSG's report could be accepted as a joint position of internationals and locals. However, these are our dreams that do not work at all. In this sense we should respect Holkeri's sincerity at least, who was very sincere regarding the recent initiatives of the Kosovar politicians.

Our politicians gave statements that they have heard Holkeri, but they did not understand him.

Editorial: Did Holkeri read the Constitutional Framework? (Kosova Sot)

Kosova Sot carried an editorial about the possibility of changes in the Constitutional Framework.

Recent exchanges of opinions between Holkeri and Daci regarding the Constitutional Framework brought back to the scene the most problematic regulation that was approved by the UN mission in Kosovo. After an emotional speech, SRSG hurried to tell the Kosovo assembly that it was a meaningless attempt to change the Constitutional Framework, because New York was the one to decide on it.

Holkeri's statement is in accordance with the UN policy towards Kosovo and it cannot be called a wrong statement.

I. However, the SRSG's statement in its essence is contradictory. If he says that the Constitutional Framework could be changed only by New York, how can it be explained that in Constitutional Framework itself the possibility to change it is foreseen. According to this regulation two thirds of votes in the Kosovo assembly

could change it. As everything in Kosovo, starting from the simplest thing and up to the legislation is under the competencies of the SRSG. However, a procedure for changing the constitutional process is left to Kosovo lawmakers. Is it possible that Holkeri is not informed regarding this article in the Constitutional Framework that gives the right to the assembly to exercise such a procedure? Every Kosovo citizen knows that for everything in Kosovo UNMIK gets approval by New York, but this conclusion is not enough to cease an act that is aimed to improve administration as well as political and institutional stability.

II. On the other hand Holkeri's statement shouldn't stop initiators of changing the Constitutional Framework. This regulation must be changed, because as it is it may produce political and institutional crisis and will not clarify the position of the institutions towards the international administration. Even Holkeri would understand that it is for his own benefit to change the Constitutional Framework. Otherwise, the elections that will be held this coming year will produce new political crisis. The change of the Constitutional Framework means avoiding an eventual crisis.

Holkeri: Political dream of Albanians (*Blic*)

The UNSC will decide on the final status of Kosovo after democratic standards have been achieved, UNMIK Head Harri Holkeri stated after the SC dedicated to the situation in the province. Endeavors by the Kosovo government to change the Constitutional Framework in order to have broader competences are futile as only the SC could do that, Holkeri pointed out. Following the session, Holkeri commented that decision as an expression of a "political dream," but also as "unrealistic and unimportant." "I understand that there is a political dream in Kosovo. At this moment, that discussion is unrealistic and unimportant because the future status of Kosovo is in the hands of the UNSC and it cannot be resolved in either Pristina or Belgrade, but only here in New York," he said.

UNSC Ambassadors welcomed Belgrade-Pristina dialogue (*Glas/Beta*)

The Ambassadors of several European countries and the US in the SC have welcomed the beginning of the Belgrade-Pristina dialogue, assessing it represents a step towards normalization and the creation of a multi-ethnic society in Kosovo. The Ambassadors of the US, Russia, Great Britain and Germany have assessed at the session that certain

progress had been made in the Serbian province, but that the security situation is still bad. They condemned the attacks on Kosovo Serbs and expressed disturbance because none of the perpetrators had been found.

Dejan Sahovic positively assessed Holkeri's speech (Politika/Tanjug)

Serbia-Montenegro Ambassador to the United Nations Dejan Sahovic has viewed as positive the speech of UNMIK Head Harri Holkeri, who, addressing the UNSC session, confirmed the need for a multiethnic Pristina delegation in further talks with Belgrade, as well as indispensability that the Kosovo government took part in the dialogue as well. Following the session, Sahovic told Tanjug that Holkeri had concentrated on the issues of security and return of refugees, Belgrade-Pristina dialogue, and realization of the "standard before status" concept. Sahovic assessed the stand by UNMIK Head Harri Holkeri on the necessity of multiethnic composition of the Pristina delegation in continuation of the dialogue with Belgrade, as positive.

UNMIK bans Nikolic election campaign in Kosovo (B92/Fonet)

UNMIK has barred Serbian Radical Party presidential candidate Tomislav Nikolic from campaigning in Mitrovica. Sources close to UNMIK's Pristina office say that the party was told that Nikolic would not be allowed into Kosovo because his safety could not be guaranteed.

Strict rules of cigarette trading introduced in Kosovo (Vecernje Novosti)

As EU representatives within UNMIK who deal with customs announce, the first cigarettes with excise stamps for the Kosovo market came out this week. The first company that completed the production of cigarettes with excise stamps on the packaging is the Tobacco Concern of Skopje. "These cigarettes will be in the stores next week," said John Robertson, the executive director of UNMIK's customs service, who managed the project of introducing excise stamps from the very beginning. "This is an important moment in regulating trade with cigarettes not only in Kosovo and Metohija, but in the region as well."

Security-Information Agency for Kosovo ceases to exist (Vecernje Novosti)

The Center of the Security-Information Agency for Kosovo and Metohija in Nis, where a horrible massacre occurred on 30 September, when five people were killed, will cease to exist as of 1 November. We learned from reliable sources that all of the employees of this center had already been displaced to other jobs, mostly outside Nis. The building of the center will remain empty at the moment, until the new owner – Phillip Morris, determines what it will be used for, and until time removes from memory a tragic and insane act.

Ceku: SaM authorities don't want to admit they lost Kosovo (Danas/Beta)

KPC commander Agim Ceku has told the Zagreb *Vecernji List* that he is touched and proud over the reaction of the citizens and authorities in Kosovo following his recent arrest in Slovenia. Asked how he commented SaM's dissatisfaction with Slovenia's decision to release him, Ceku replied that this is "yet another proof that the authorities in SaM did not change, that there had been only a replacement, so the current authorities were not showing readiness to admit the realistic situation in Kosovo, i.e. that Kosovo was lost for them forever."

Kosovo Serbs satisfied with SC session (Danas/Tanjug)

Representatives of Kosovo Serbs are satisfied with the Thursday evening UNSC session in New York, at which the current situation in Kosovo and Metohija was discussed. The only Serbian minister in the Kosovo government, Goran Bogdanovic, said on Friday that for the greatest part we could be satisfied with the way the situation in Kosovo and Metohija was discussed at the Security Council session.

Oliver Ivanovic's reactions to the UNSC session (Glas)

UNMIK Head Harri Holkeri has assessed in the report he had submitted to the UNSC that the main problem in Kosovo and Metohija is that too many people silently tolerate violence on national grounds, and stressed this should be stopped. "This is very good in the sense of the further resolution of the situation in Kosovo and Metohija, because it is still didn't happen in Kosovo and Metohija for the Albanian majority to condemn crimes and offer support to UNMIK police in fighting crime. It is clear that the Kosovo police is young and insufficiently trained to quickly and adequately react, but it is clear that it must do much more regarding this," said Oliver Ivanovic, Kosovo Assembly Presidency member.

A Serb beaten up in the center of Gnjilane (Glas/Tanjug)

A 70 year-old Serb from the village of Donja Budriga, Djura Stojkovic, sustained severe injuries in the center of Gnjilane. Stojkovic was brutally attacked while walking down the main street towards the Cadastral Office. According to his statement, the last thing he remembers is a strong blow to his head. He was found laying unconscious on the street with a large cut on his head by KPS and UNMIK Police which transferred him to a local hospital and then, as an urgent case, to the hospital in Vranje.

Rasim Ljajic opened regional conference (Glas/Fonet)

While inaugurating the Conference on Dialogue and Cooperation of Citizens and Local Authorities, SaM Minsiter for Human and Minority Rights Rasim Ljajic said that, apart from progress in the south of Serbia, there still were unresolved problems, but that the situation which had occurred three years ago when there had been armed conflict in that region, should not be repeated under any circumstances.
